Scripture Reflection

Today the Liturgy of the Church asks us to focus upon Mary. The Gospel is one that is used frequently for Feasts of Our Lady but today it takes on extra significance as we await the birth of the Saviour. The name of Jesus, the Son of the Most High, the mention of David and Jacob all point to the reality that the Messiah is both fully human and fully divine. According to the eternal plan, Mary is chosen – but not forced – to be the holy Virgin Mother (Gospel: Luke 1:26-38). Nathan first allows David to build a house (Temple) for God but then the Lord announces that he will build a house for David (First Reading: 2 Samuel 7:1-5.8-12.14.16). At the end of his Letter to the Romans Paul talks of the revelation of the mystery now revealed – Jesus Christ (Second Reading: Romans 16:25-27).

Responsorial Psalm meditation: 'I will sing for ever of your love, O Lord.' (Psalm 88/89:1).

You may like to say this as a meditation on your Rosary.
