Parishioners from Corpus Christi and CAFOD parishes across the country were represented on the walk to Parliament to promote climate justice last Friday, 21 April. The pilgrimage started at St John's Church Waterloo, with a service focused on a God's good world and our treatment of it, with input from people from the Philippines and Kenya about the impact of climate change. Then about 2,000 Christians walked to Parliament via the Shell building on the South Bank. The pilgrimage paused there

while Lord Sentamu (formerly Archbishop of York) handed in a letter asking Shell to move away from oil to renewables, urging it to become an energy company rather than a fossil fuel one.
