

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

This year we read on the Sundays of the Year from the Gospel of Mark. It is the shortest Monday and most fast moving of the Gospels. There is a sense in which there is not time to Tuesday lose. There are no infancy narratives - Jesus appears preaching and calling his first Wednesday 2 Samuel 7:4-17; Ps 88; Mark 4:1-20 disciples (Gospel: Mark 1:14-20). Jonah tries to escape from the command of the Lord Thursday to preach repetance to the worst of sinnsers- the Ninevites. But the Lord prevails and Friday they repent (First Reading: Jonah 3:1-5,10). St Paul urges the Corinthians to keep all in Saturday the perspective of eternity (Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:29-31).
