

From Friday's Gospel: Luke 2:22-40

When the day came for them to be purified as laid down by the Law of Moses, the parents of Jesus took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord - observing what stands written in the Law of the Lord: Every firstborn male must be consecrated to the Lord.

It had been revealed to Simeon by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he had set eves on the Christ of the Lord. Prompted by the Spirit (Simeon) came to the Temple and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the Law required he took him into his arms and blessed God; and he said: Now, Master, you can let your servant go in peace, just as you promised; because my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see, a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of vour people Israel.

In the Painting:

Simeon acknowledges the infant Jesus as the longawaited Messiah. This is one of the meeting points of the Old and New Testaments. Simeon had been waiting for this moment a long time. So Friday's feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple demonstrates the dedication of Simeon and the wisdom of a life completely dedicated to the search for God's Face

Pope at Audience: Avarice is a sickness of the heart, not of the wallet.

At the weekly General Audience, Pope Francis continued his catechesis on vice and virtue with a reflection on avarice, saying the certainty of death is an effective reminder that we must be generous with our goods in this life since we cannot take our money beyond the grave.

Too often, the Pope said, we "forget the Gospel preaching, which does not claim that riches are a sin in themselves, but they are certainly a liability." SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

After calling his first disciples Jesus launches into his ministry in Capernaum and Galilee. Monday Significantly he goes first to the Synagogue and teaches and heals the tormented man. It is these actions that demonstrate Jesus' absolute authority and this is recognized by the crowd (Gospel: Mark 1:21-28). Moses looks forward to the day when the Lord will Thursday raise up a prophet that ultimately is greater even than Moses himself (First Reading: Friday Deuteronomy 18:15-20). St. Paul teaches the advantages of remaining unmarried (Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:32-25).


